### Welcome

We cordially invite you to participate in the 2<sup>nd</sup> International Medical Class Paediatric Critical Care within the 27<sup>th</sup> Bremen Symposium on Intensive Care Medicine + Nursing.

About a third of the world's population is still without access to adequate quality health care. In poor countries particularly, the absence of paediatric critical care resources leaves parents without any chance to receive the needed life-saving treatment for their seriously ill children. Lack of qualified staff and financial resources are the major problems.

Robin Aid Foundation is committed, within the international medical network of Chaîne de l'Espoir Europe, to set up paediatric critical care in poor and underserved countries. Local partner hospitals receive support from medical teams, equipment and structured training programs.

Education as well as exchange of experiences are fundamental needs which enable local physicians and nurses to become

self-sufficient as soon as possible. On their way to independence access to international knowledge as well as personal contacts to foreign colleagues are of great importance.

The International Medical Class Paediatric Critical Care provides such a forum. Fellows from different international projects of RobinAid and Chaîne de l'Espoir Europe are invited to attend on this annual scientific event.
